## February 2023 Car of the month



**Woody Jacobson - 1967 Mustang Convertible**

This 1967 Mustang Convertible was produced on November 23, 1966 at the San Jose assembly plant. Features and options include 289 2bbl, C-4 automatic, power top, AM-FM radio, standard parchment interior, Raven Black exterior, power steering, exterior décor group, folding glass rear window, deluxe seat belts and Style Steel wheels. Of the 44,808 convertibles produced in 1967 only 122 had this paint and trim code, making this a relatively rare pony. I purchased the car in 1985 from a minister in Auburn, WA. This mustang was his daily driver and he was gifted the pony from his dad, so it was sort of a one owner. When I bought it there definitely was evidence of a pony well used and put away wet. The rear of the car was caved in from leaving it in neutral outside of the church, where it rolled into a pole. The driver seat was held up by a brick that would dislodge when you hit a bump, propelling the driver into the back seat. The transmission would slip in every gear and bothersome items such as the convertible brace and shock tower braces were removed and discarded. This had the effect of making it a true flexible flyer. First order of business was to get the pony into drivable shape. Including a transmission rebuild, replacing braces, hoses, and belts and taking care of the seat issue. In one comical moment, I watched as a friend ran across the front of the garage with the seat in hand, in flames, trying to get to the water faucet. Over the years I have owned several Mustangs-all in better shape-but I have kept this one. In my opinion the convertible is the quintessential definition of mustang fun. There have been many memorable trips such as a trip to Great Falls, Mt and numerous trips in Eastern Washington and Western Washington for shows and pleasure. This Pony now has 200,000 miles on the odometer. I want to thank the Moses Lake Classic Car Club for this opportunity to showcase this Pony. Plans are to keep the car and improve its looks and drivability.
